Section Two: Committee and Subcommittee Reports

I.ASA Committee Reports

1. Membership (Damian Doria) reappointed

For Membership, I'm happy to report that we're reviewing a candidate from TCAA for Fellow and would be happier to review more. Let's get nominations going where appropriate. Folks can reach out to me if they don't know the procedures for nomination. **Tony Hoover** is the previous rep and can speak about it if necessary in the TCAA session. On the general membership, the committee has reviewed and approved more than 50 new applications for full membership this Spring and 9 of those listed TCAA as primary or secondary field of interest. I think the breakdown was 7 primary 2 secondary. Remind everyone that the dues are the same for Associates after 5 years as for Full Members, but Associates pay \$35 extra for the Journal. Anyone can be a full member if they're a "...person active in acoustics, who has an academic degree in acoustics or in a closely related field or who has had the equivalent of an academic degree in scientific or professional experience in acoustics."

- If you have not read the Fellows process email that was created, please read it and save it for future reference, **Damian Doria** is a good contact if you believe you have a good candidate.
- We have also recently approved a good number of full members who were formerly student or associate members. Several were in TCAA and TC Noise, so great to have them aboard and tell their friends to sign up too.
- Moving from associate member to full member (typical grad students) is a concern after 5 years as associate member- these people cannot vote or be in office, so converting is good. If you are an associate please see your TC chair. Note that you can become a full member from associate in less than 5 years.

5. Publications Policy (Eddie Lau)

- The Publication Policy Committee was held on 5 May 2023.
 - Data Availability Policy: ASA Publication is now aligned with AIPP policy with a complete Author Declaration section for the data availability.
 - Authors are also requested to answer questions for collecting self-reported demographic information in the manuscript submission system.
 - AIPP has done "Publishing Services Gap Analysis", which includes strengths, opportunities, aspirations, and results. During the meeting, there was a discussion about the change of the role of associate editors from gatekeeper to shepherd.

6. POMA - Proceedings of Meetings on Acoustics (Lauren Ronsse)

Proceedings of Meetings on Acoustics (POMA) is an editor-reviewed, open-access, online journal published by the Acoustical Society of America (ASA). Articles originate as papers presented at semiannual ASA meetings or at other cosponsored meetings. Both researchers and practitioners are encouraged to submit manuscripts to POMA.

7. Women in Acoustics (Kaitlyn Hunt/Ana Jaramillo)

Round table discussion: Wednesday, May 10th from 2:30-3:30pm at KANE

 - The WIA committee is also sponsoring a Lactation Room/Mother's Room during this meeting and plans to continue this at future meetings.

A summary with more information was generated by members of the College of Fellows, Membership Committee, and others. A draft summary was distributed on 26 April; a more complete version is attached to this agenda.

11. Medals and Awards (Tony Hoover)

- TCAA is eligible in 2023 for a Silver Medal award. For TCAA, this is called the Wallace Clement Sabine Medal. Eligibility is determined by a formula that includes various factors such as the number of members in the TC. MAC selected a nominee (i.e., we have a winner!), and submitted to Executive Council for their review and confirmation. The winner will be announced in due course, soon.

12. Standards (Derrick Knight)

- Ongoing collaborating with INCE to offer ASA standards as part of INCE measurement certification program.
- We are encouraging development of practical guides in the use of sound standards. The most recent example was developed by **Davyd Betchka**l of NPS and is titled "Establishing the Residual Sound Level on Protected Natural Areas: A Modern Approach for Practitioners and Planners." This is a guide for the application of ASA/ANSI S12.100. We hope to see more guides developed, please contact Seve Lind, ASA Standards Director, if interested.

We also encourage video guides, though we have no examples as-yet (this would be breaking new ground).

13. Practitioners and Industry (Derrick Knight)

- TC Liaisons we are establishing CoPI liaisons to each TC. Tony Hoover is AA liaison. Each TC is in a different place with regard to P&I. TCAA is obviously at the high end of engagement, which is why we are able to support new initiatives like the Solutions Showcase. I would like to see TCAA make an effort to find collaborators within other TCs who have lower P&I engagement to plan special sessions. Please collaborate with Tony if you have ideas.
- S12.100 pamphlet mentioned above came out of CoPI, please coordinate with ASA Standards for future efforts.
- Day of ASHRAE Collaborative Special session for New Orleans meeting, TCNS, TCAA, CoPI plus ASHRAE TC2.6. We hope this is model for TC to collaborate with outside organizations when a true Joint Meeting isn't practical.
- Student Career Mixer we intend to launch this here in Chicago, but the details were coordinated too late. We will aim for Ottawa or possibly New Orleans to launch this initiative.

Abstract for Student Career Mixer: Students will mingle with representatives from potential employers in industry, government institutions, and consulting firms during an informal lunch. The purpose of this event is to expose students to career opportunities with an emphasis on cross-technical committee awareness. Employers will be representing their firm, lab or institution but will also be prepared to discuss careers more broadly. Whether you are a student who is confident in seeking a career within the technical area you are studying, or you are student who has begun thinking about broadening your career aspirations in a new direction within acoustics, this event will have relevant opportunities for you to explore. Registration is required and only available to students.

14. Student Council (Olivia Heui Young Park)

- Record registration for Student Outreach for Networking and Integrating Colleagues (SONIC) peer-mentoring program. 30 students registered with only 10 peer-mentors. Experienced students and professionals who have graduated within 2 years are welcome to register for the next ASA meeting.

- Student Council is hosting a special session on Thursday, May 11: Guidance from the Experts: Applying for Grants and Fellowships.
- Olivia Heui Young Park, the new Student Council representative for TCAA

15. Panel on Public Policy (Eric Reuter)

- The Panel on Public Policy met remotely last week. Ed Walsh will be stepping down as Chair after this meeting and Eric Reuter will take over for a three-year term.
- Active projects at PoPP:
 - IEQ-GA: ASA is a member of the Indoor Environmental Quality Global Alliance with Eric Reuter as our representative. ASA has now been a member for long enough to qualify for a position on the Board of Directors and Eric has agreed to serve for a 3-year term. An IEQ summit is planned for 2025, likely in Montreal. Eric has been invited to join the steering committee to ensure that acoustics is considered for a keynote speech and/or paper track.
 - **Restaurant Acoustics: Brigitte Shulte-Fortkamp** and **Wade Bray** are heading up this effort to determine whether ASA should offer a position statement or other public guidance on acoustics in restaurants and similar public accommodations. Discussions centered around possible strategies to encourage owners to consider acoustics and the separate but related issues of worker noise exposure and patron comfort.
 - Acoustics and Climate Change: A special session was held Monday (yesterday) in support of the effort to draft a position on the effects of climate change on acoustics.

16. Education (Jim Degrandis)

- The possibility of splitting EdCom into two groups got favorable feedback in the Nashville session but there are still some logistical hurdles and is being evaluated by EC. These two parts would essentially be:
 - **Outreach and Education Committee**: a smaller committee (perhaps 6-10 members) that would fall under Administrative Council on Outreach, and which would focus on the administrative issues, the outreach activities that ASA is involved with (Booths at STEM fairs and professional conferences attended by under-represented minorities undergraduates and faculty), the

development and distribution of the ASA Teaching Activity Kit, outreach events during ASA meetings, etc.

- Education in Acoustics Technical Committee: elevating ED to a TC would allow for greater focus on acoustics education research, sessions on teaching pedagogy, mentoring of students, and the development of educational resources. An ED TC would also showcase the important role Acoustics Education plays in forwarding the ASA mission and purpose statement.
- Also, (and as always) there were only two new nominations for the Rossing Prize this time around. Nominees do not need to be working at an educational institution to be considered. Reach out to the members of the nominating committee for more information.

- This unprecedented crisis is expected to drive expansion in healthcare construction with further attention to acoustics to ensure accurate communication and to support patient sleep.
- Efforts are also underway to evaluate and enhance acoustic standards for specific patient populations, including pediatric cancer patients.
