4. Committee to Improve Racial Diversity and Inclusivity – CIRDI (Peggy Nelson)

SURIEA (Summer Undergraduate Research or Internship Experience in Acoustics) has 7 new folks for the summer and suggesting outreach to HBCU's (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) by TC members to spread the word. Also reaching out to those with no direct route of access to acoustics, Chicano, Native Americans, women in engineering, STEM job boards, and minority institutions.

We have voted to provide 1 year of funding to the CIRDI (\$40k); they are looking for other sources. The money will come from the \$70k per year that is set aside for TI's. Note that last year's TI expenditure was \$32300, and this year (2023) it does not appear that we will come near that, so this money is unused.

Section Two: Committee and Subcommittee Reports

I.ASA Committee Reports

1. Membership (Damian Doria) reappointed

- Membership is doing well overall, with 8 new Full Members in the last 6 months identifying TCAA as primary or secondary interests.
- If anyone is an Associate ,or Student Member who is soon ineligible to continue as student status, consider applying for Full Membership. Associate Membership is currently \$50 less per year than Full Membership. After 5 years as an Associate Member, your dues increase to the same as a Full Member, so there's no savings long term. Associates who've been in the Society for more than 5 years still must fill out a short application to be approved for Full Membership. You must be a Full Member to be eligible to vote or become a candidate for ASA elected offices. Of course, all of you want to have a vote in the electoral process even if you're not ready to volunteer for elected service to the Society. So, go apply now. Thank you to all the Full Members and Fellows for your ongoing support and participation in the Society.

From Damien: As a side note, I'm not sure if/when my Membership Comm term is up, but I'd love to roll off. If TCAA can find an interested party most of the work is minor and concentrated just before the Membership Committee meetings twice a year. Basically, you review the applications for Full Membership to see if a candidate in the AA field is ineligible for some reason and request more info if necessary. For reference, I've had one that needed more info than provided in the application and they provided it and were accepted. So, not a challenging task. Fellow nominations are a little more work but we have had 1 to 3 per year to present to the Committee. It involves taking the nomination letters and nominee's CV and adding information to a summary for the Committee members using a template the Committee has developed in recent years. Then, at the meeting we present the candidate briefly to the Committee members who should have reviewed the summary prior to the meeting. There's some discussion and the Committee votes. It helps to spend a bit of time becoming familiar with your candidate's qualifications, but aside from that, there's not a lot of work involved in the Fellowship process either.

Articles originate as papers presented at semiannual ASA meetings or at other cosponsored meetings. Both researchers and practitioners are encouraged to submit manuscripts to POMA.

POMA holds a series of society-wide student paper competitions for a POMA submission based on a presentation or poster from ASA meetings.

Award Amounts: Up to five student papers will receive an award of USD \$300. Additionally, the student paper winners will be noted on the POMA cover page and their article will be promoted in email and social media campaigns.

Mechanics: Student authors will indicate they want to participate in the competition at the time of submission.

Timeline: The competition deadline is 11:59 pm Eastern Standard Time, 30 days after the meeting.

- At the May 12, 2023 meeting of the Executive Council, the EC voted unanimously to begin the process of converting EDCOM into a Technical Specialty Group as the next step toward becoming a full-fledged Technical Committee.
- On December 3, 2023 at the ASA Sydney meeting, the Executive Council will formally vote to:
 - Sunset the current Administrative Committee on Education in Acoustics
 - Establish a new Technical Specialty Group (TSG) on Education in Acoustics (ED)
 - Establish a new Administrative Committee on Outreach and Education (... effectively dividing EDCOM into a Technical and an Administrative committee.)
 - ED will begin functioning as a Technical Specialty Group at the ASA 186 Ottawa Meeting.
 - o ED will operate as a Technical Specialty Group for three (3) years
 - Must obtain support of 2% of the individual ASA membership (select ED as their 1st, 2nd, or 3rd choice)
 - Continue organizing special sessions and other functions as we have been doing.
 - TSG is not represented on Committee on Medals and Awards, Membership Committee, Student Council, or ASACOS.
 - TSG is not eligible for technical area awards of the Society but may encourage the timely preparation and submission of dossiers for Fellowship of the Society.

- Membership of this new admin committee will be appointed by ASA president
